God's Unspeakable Gift

(Rom 8:32)

- I. <u>Problem #2</u>- Is there any chance of God's love for us fading or passing away?
 - A) Our entire case is dependent upon God's love for us
 - 1. Paul proves this eternal love by arguing from the greater to the lesser
 - i. As he did in Rom 5:8-10
 - ii. God has already performed the greatest possible act of love
 - a) If He has performed the greater, can He fail at the lesser?
 - 2. Paul bases his entire argument upon biblical doctrine and facts
 - i. He doesn't simply say "God loves you and I love you"
 - ii. He founds his logic upon absolute and concrete facts: God gave Christ!
 - a) This argument is centered on the doctrine of atonement
 - 1) It is what we believe concerning this doctrine that matters most
 - (a) Many professing Christians today say doctrine isn't important
 - (1) But it is only through the doctrines given us that we can know and come to understand not only the love of God, but the acts of God
 - (b) Many people wear crosses around their neck, but what do they believe about the biblical doctrine of atonement?
 - (c) Any person who bases their confidence in God or salvation upon experience and not doctrinal facts has no security whatsoever

II. Rom 8:32

A) <u>Terms</u>:

- 1. \underline{Ge} The first word is rarely translated, yet it is 1^{st} in the Greek
 - i. It means "surely, indeed, most certainly"
 - ii. This word is in the Greek and chosen by Paul to intensify his argument
- 2. "He"- God did it and will do it
 - i. It wasn't men or the devil or anyone else that gave the Lord Jesus Christ to die at Calvary, it was the Father
 - a) This is very important today as many are teaching that the cross was the act of men and that the God of love will forgive even that sin
 - b) Isa 53
 - c) John 19:11- "Thou could have no power against Me....."
 - d) Acts 2:22- "The determinate counsel of God"
 - e) Acts 4:26-28- "Whatsoever Thy hand and counsel have determined..."
 - f) 2 Cor 5:21- "For God gave Christ....."

- ii. People deny this fact because they deny the fact that God can have wrath
 - a) "God hates the sin, but loves the sinner"
 - 1) But it isn't the sin He cast into the lake of fire, it is the sinner!
- 3. "His Own Son"- Why was it that died at Calvary?
 - i. The most beloved and precious to God, His eternal Son
 - a) He wasn't simply a prophet or a fine moral man, or even a pacifist
 - b) He wasn't an "adopted son" as believers are said to be (8:14-17)
 - ii. John 1:1- "The Word...."
 - iii. Heb 1:3- "The express image of God....."
- 4. "Spared"- This is taken from Gen 22:16 LXX
 - i. As Abraham held nothing back, even his most beloved
 - ii. God not only did not spare Christ in offering, He spared Him nothing that was necessary for our atonement (pain, shame, humility, reproach, etc.)
- 5. "Delivered Him up"- To hand over into the power of another
 - i. This is the positive action of God as compared to the negative in "spared not"
 - ii. Rom 4:25- "Delivered for our offenses..."
 - a) Delivered up to who or what?
 - 1) Luke 22:53- "The power of darkness"
 - 2) John 14:30- "The prince of this world"
 - 3) 2 Cor 5:21- "Sin"
 - 4) Gal 3:13- "The curse"
 - 5) Matt 27:46- "Forsaken"
 - 6) Phil 2:8- "Humbling death of the cross"
 - 7) Heb 12:2- "Shame"
 - b) Isa 53- Look at the words of this prophetic foresight of the work of the Lord Jesus Christ:
 - 1) Despised and rejected
 - 2) Sorrow and grief
 - 3) Stricken, smitten and afflicted
 - 4) Wounded and bruised, striped
 - 5) Oppressed and slaughtered
 - 6) Offering for sin
 - 7) Travail
 - (a) All of this is to say "God's wrath and displeasure"
 - (b) This is what the agony of the garden of Gethsemane was all about
- 6. "For"- In place of, in the stead of (instead of you and me)

- 7. "Us all" The saints, the church, the elect of v.28-30
 - i. Rom 5:6-11- The undeserving and vile us of this passage
- 8. "Freely"- All is of God's grace and no merit can be found in the recipients
 - i. Freely He gave the greatest and therefore will freely give the lesser
- 9. "All things"- Same "all things" as in v.28
- B) It is only by understanding what the Father did in Christ that we can ever begin to understand anything of the love of God
 - 1. This was the only way He could forgive sin (Rom 3:26-27)
 - 2. If God shed forth this kind of love on us when enemies, will He now love less when we are His children?
 - i. Phil 1:6- "He which hath begun a good work will perform it..."
 - ii. Phil 4:19- "God shall supply all your need...."
 - iii. 2 Cor 9:8- "God is able to make all grace abound to us...."
